Choose **ONE** of the following five comparative essay questions. You need **3 texts** for whichever question you choose. Make sure to have a <u>thesis</u> in a **complete**, **original**, **and informed** essay, with an introduction, a body, and a conclusion. Please proofread carefully! GOOD LUCK!

- 1. Discuss the concept and practice of **duty**. How would you describe the relationship between the agent (in the form of a god or the rational mind) issuing the command and the human being executing it? What is the role of personal conviction, if any, in the matter?
- 2. What is **happiness** according to Lucretius, Aristotle, and Plato? And what is its relationship to **virtuous behavior**?
- 3. Compare and contrast Dido, Kalypso, and the harlot as **three women** with whom the respective heroes, Aeneas, Odysseus, and Gilgamesh, engage in a sexual act. Consider the following: purpose, duration of relationship, effect on both, etc.
- 4. Compare three distinct views on **death and/or the afterlife** (as sometimes illustrated in the Underworld). What do they inform us about life on earth?
- Virgil, Lucretius, and Aristotle have very different notions of fate or predetermination versus human free will. Compare and contrast!
