 - B) How do the female characters in in "Midaq Alley" and "Season of a Migration" conform or reject the traditional role that women play in their societies? Can any other them be described as "Feminists" though none would have ever heard the term?
- III. A) According to Popper what is meant by "Piecemeal Social Engineering" and "Holistic or Utopian Social Engineering"? Why is one a recipe for disaster?
 - B) According to Popper, "Trends are not laws." How does this relate to Darwin ("can there be a law of evolution?"), Marx and Freud?
