- 1. Popper's critique of Freud or Marx: summarize it, and indicate what is the theoretical basis for the criticism.
- 2. Simone de Bouvoire's solution to the problem of the inequality of women (p.16): paraphrase it and give the Marxist theory behind it.

II. Absurdity and Transcendence. (30%)

- 1. Define some major elements of "absurdity" as found in Man's Fate and Waiting for Godot.
- 2. State clearly the difference between an absurdist interpretation of *Man's Fate* and one that claims genuine transcendence. Illustrate.
- 3. Do you find absurdist aspects in other texts you read in <u>C.S. 204</u>? Describe and illustrate.
- 4. Can you find absurdist elements in other texts you have read in $\underline{\text{C.S. 201}} 203$? Identify and justify your choices.
- 5. Do you think there is meaning in human life, or would you agree with either Beckett or Nietzsche? Give reasons.

III. Orientalism and Tayyib Salih. (30%)

- 1. Identify <u>common themes</u> dealt with by Said and Salih in their books. Illustrate the way each deals with the themes you select.
- 2. How does Salih deal with the theme of violence?
- 3. What are your thoughts on the themes you have written about in #s 1 and 2 above?

Write a <u>brief reflection</u> on your encounter with the C.S. Program. What do you think you gained from it? What do you see are its <u>weaknesses</u> that can be improved? Has it influenced you in any way, in your own self-understanding and understanding of the world you live in?
