Refer to the texts you read whenever possible. (70%)
 - 1. In A Brief History of Time, Hawking wrote:

 "It has certainly been true in the past that what we call intelligence and scientific discovery has conveyed a survival advantage. It is not so clear that this is still the case: our scientific discoveries may well destroy us all." In the light of Darwin's theories of the struggle for existence and de Beauvoir's idea that the human mind is programmed to draw lines and react with hostility towards the Other, do you believe that world peace is possible, or is the human species moving towards a high-tech holocaust?
 - 2. Is it true that human life is a hopeless, ridiculous wait for Godot, as Beckett says, or does it have meaning, as Naguib Mahfouz seems to believe? In brief, does human life have value? Argue for or against.
