
Part I: Required question (50%)

1) On Freedom

b) The Second Sex

To emancipate Woman is to refuse to confine her to the relations she bears to man, not to deny them to her; let her have her independent existence and she will continue none the less to exist for him also; mutually recognizing each other as subject, each will yet remain for the other an other. The reciprocity of their relations will not do away with the miracles - desire, possession, love, dream, adventure - worked by the division of human beings into two separate categories; and the words that move us - giving, conquering, uniting - will not lose their meaning. On the contrary when we abolish the slavery of half of humanity, then the "division" of humanity will reveal its genuine significance and the human couple will find its true form."

c) Season of Migration

"Women belong to men, and a man's a man even if he's decrepit".

Analyze these statements in theiur proper contexts.

- Discuss the protests of women in these novels.

Consider the extent to which they are protesting against their condition as females (biologically, socially...) and the extent to which they are protesting against conditions that affect both man and women.
