<u>1789</u> – <u>French Revolution</u> Liberty/Equality/Fraternity Human Rights U N (1945)

> 60th birthday <u>191</u> free nations at UN to-day.

- <u>1905</u> Einstein, <u>Relativity</u> (E = mc2) Time & space are relative Truth is relative
- 1927 Heisenberg, Quantum Physics Uncertainty principle
- 1960's Man walks on the moon.
- <u>1970's</u> Increasing development of theoretical astro-physics
- <u>1988</u> Hawking, <u>A Brief History of Time</u> Scientists aim at discovering a complete theory which would bring together <u>Relativity</u> and <u>Quantum Physics</u>: "We would know then the mind of God". (p. 175)

"The dispossession of a people": exodus, alienation, despair:

- I have witnessed the massacre I am a victim of a map ...will/you accept my name My only code-name-Mahmoud Darwish? The police and Carmel's pines Have whipped my real name Off my skin
- 1953 Abdel-Nasser; the dream of a great Arab nation revived.
- 1961 The process of decolonization reaches a peak with the Algerian independence.
- 1967 Six-day-war. Utter Arab defeat. The end of the dream.
- 1975 1990 "Civil War" in Lebanon.
- 1996 Arafat, President of a mini-Palestinian State.
- 2006 July war (Lebanon VS Israel)

A CVSP QUESTION

How have men and women reacted to such an acceleration of inventions and catastrophes? A bird's eye view on our readings.

A. Western Man/Woman

- 1. Breakdown of faith, reason, and truth with Nietzsche and Freud. Man/Woman in the grip of drives, passions. For Nietzsche there is no Truth but only personal perspective. For Freud, truths, morals, are sublimations of the sexual drive.
- 2. Faustian man as encountered in Hawking. (The desire to be master of the universe at whatever cost).
- 3. Twilight of the world in Thomas Mann.

- 4. Feminist revolution in Simone de Beauvoir → Existentialism →Lucidity, courage, responsibility; the "freedom to be"; anguish accepted as the price to be paid for liberty.
- 5. Beckett's <u>Nihilism</u> \rightarrow the absurdist sensibility \rightarrow Malraux, Camus, Sartre...etc.
- 6. Solzhenitsyn's Gulag.

B. Arab Man/Woman

- 1. <u>Naguib Mahfouz</u>: Poverty as absolute evil.
- 2. <u>Tayeb Salih</u>: Colonization/Decolonization, a lethal game, Faustian man as carrier of death vs. a common humanity.

The East – West bind

- 3. <u>Edward Said</u>: distorted representations of the Other vs. mutual respect. The need to build bridges between nations, between I and the Other.
- III. <u>CONCLUSION:</u> Some food for thought. Some issues facing us today; a quick view.
 - <u>Globalization</u> as a process vs. <u>Globalism</u> as a state of being, a condition which would make human beings and nations interact justly. A planetary citizenship?
 - <u>Scientific progress:</u> Longer life span Better hygiene

Better medical care...etc.

Rapid transportation...etc.

but no progress in ethics, in moral awareness; the problems posed by <u>bio-ethics</u> (genetic manipulation, cloning...etc).

<u>Technology</u>: is it dehumanizing man/woman?

- The <u>Environment</u>. Excessive abuse of natural resources (water, oil, forests...etc.) nature humbles man/woman: Tsunamis, Katrinas...etc. Roughly 6 million people today as against 1 million at the beginning of the 20th c.
- <u>The Media:</u> information vs. misinformation
- <u>The Brains Business, Knowledge Economy</u> replacing physical resources. Knowledge based industries-→ Most important agents of knowledge economy are the universities. Number of students at universities in the world has doubled in the last 20 years (see <u>The Economist</u>, Sept. 10-16, 2005)
- <u>The 3rd World War: Terrorism</u> \rightarrow advanced technology used to terrorize, to kill in the most "fluid" style. Globalization vs. Manichaeism
- The climate, the mood of our epoch:

Exhilaration of human power (hybris?) vs Disenchantment. The ambiguities of the concept of <u>Progress</u>. Man/Woman consumer machines without a soul? Post-modern creatures? What vision? What direction?
