#### Part I Essay (20pts)

Define the notions *competence* and *performance*. Studies in human language processing and conversational analysis show the importance of CONTEXT (linguistic or non-linguistic) for successful language performance. Discuss a type of study in human language processing and a Gricean Maxim to illustrate this point.

#### Part II Short answer questions and exercises (80 pts)

- (1) Define briefly the following terms: Mutual intelligibility, Garden Path sentences, Register. (15pts)
- (2) Identify briefly two major problems that current research in speech understanding faces and aims to solve in the future. (16 pts)
- (3) Explain why there is no entailment relation between the following two sentences: (4pts)
  - a. ABC filters remove bacteria from your drinking water.
  - b. If you use ABC filters, your drinking water will be free of bacteria.
- (4) For each of the following conversational excerpts, name a maxim that has been flouted/violated and explain how. (20pts)

**Example:** I'm a millionaire (*Actually you're penniless*).

Maxim: Quality. The speaker has failed to tell the truth.

- a. A: So tell me, do you like what I did to my hair?  
B: Er ... what's on TV tonight?
  - b. Don't be silly. I *love* working 80 hours a week with no vacation.
  - c. A: What are the three most important things in real estate?  
B: Location, location, and location.
  - d. (*I come home last night, and there's a car in the dining room.*)  
Me: How did you get the car in the dining room?  
My wife: It was easy. I made a left turn when I came out of the kitchen.
- (5) We have observed three semantic relations among sentences: P(araphrase), E(ntailment), and C(ontradiction). Which of these relations is exemplified in each of the following pairs of sentences? (*Hint: use N, for none*) (10pts)

- (a) If you go to the party, I'll go too.  
If you don't go to the party, I won't go.
- (b) At least 30 people will come to the party.  
At least 20 people will come to the party.
- (c) My pet cobra likes the taste of chocolate fudge.  
My pet cobra finds chocolate fudge tasty.
- (d) Vera is an only child.  
Olga is Vera's sister.
- (e) John remembered to send Mary a gift.  
John sent Mary a gift.

(6) (a) What is a metaphor? (15pts)

- (b) In the sentences that follow identify the word (or phrase) that is used metaphorically and determine, for each set of sentences, the basis for each metaphor.

- Example:** i. They got into a heated argument  
ii. She gave him an icy stare  
iii. He gave her the cold shoulder

The metaphors in (i-iii) describe human relations in terms of *temperature*.

- (a) i. The eye of a needle  
ii. The foot of the bed  
iii. The hands of the clock  
iv. The arms of a chair  
v. The table legs
- (b) i. This lecture is easy to digest  
ii. He just eats up the lecturer's words  
iii. Chew on this thought for a while  
iv. Listen to this juicy piece of gossip
