**Instructions:** Answer any *four* (4) of the following questions.

- 1. Describe the territorial boundaries of the Austrian Empire about 1740. Explain in what ways was this new empire different from the Holy Roman Empire?
- 2. Explain what is meant by Prussian "militarism", and how it affected Prussian economy and society.
- 3. Compare and contrast the development and consequences of the "Mississippi Bubble" episode in France and the "South Sea Bubble" in England.
- 4. Identify the principal parties and discuss the principal issues involved in both the war of the Austrian Succession and the Seven Years' War.
- 5. Discuss the attitude of each of the French trio (Montesquieu, Voltaire, Rousseau) toward: religion and the church, the state, and the question of freedom.
- 6. What features distinguished enlightened despots from earlier monarchs? How does the career of Joseph II of Austria illustrate both these characteristics and the limitations of enlightened despots?
- 7. Explain the various legal, social and economic aspects subsumed under the term "Old Regime", and assess its relevance to French society in the late eighteenth century.
- 8. Discuss the nature, motives and consequences of the religious measures adopted by the Constituent Assembly.
- 9. Discuss the problems and difficulties faced by the Convention in the Spring of 1793 and the program it followed to deal with them.
- 10. Explain the origins, purpose and nature of Napoleon's Continental System, and the reasons for its failure.
