Answer ONE (1) question ONLY:

I. MYTH=SCIENCE?

- 1. Select two (2) natural phenomena (e.g. earthquake, seasons, rain, day and night, or any other) and analyze the explanations offered in the relevant two myths.
- 2. Are these explanations consistent and logical within the framework of the myth? Explain.
- 3. Are these explanations "scientific"? Give Stephen Hawking's point of view.
- 4. Conclude and state your OWN opinion.

OR II: WOMAN

- 2. Compare critically with the role and function of "woman" in the second version of creation in GENESIS.
- 3. What are the implications for man/woman relationship in each case, and for their relation with the creator?
- 4. Evaluate the consequences, with reflections on our human condition.

OR III: REVENGE

- 1. Analyze the reason and the motive for revenge in two (2) myths (why and what for).
- 2. Does it serve a purpose? Explain.
- 3. Evaluate and state your own opinion on the "values" defended and/or the "change" effected.

OR IV: DEATH

- 1. Analyze the concept of death in two (2) myths, with particular emphasis on its origin, nature, role and function, relationship with creator.
- 2. Identify the <u>time</u> of "creation" or "appearance" of death. Relate with the aim or purpose of this creation/appearance.
- 3. Conclude and state your opinion.
