- 2. Better to reign in hell than serve in heaven.
- 3. Shemei, whose youth did early promise bring Of zeal to God and Hatred to his king; Did wisely from expensive sins refrain, And never broke the Sabbath but for gain.

PART TWO: (70%)

Choose TWO of the following topics. In each case, write an organized, well-developed essay. As often as you can, make specific references to the texts under discussion.

- 1. Compare and contrast the love poetry of John Donne with his religious poetry.
- 2. Trace the principles of neo-classicism in Dryden's Absolom and Achitophel.
- 3. Chaucer's knight and Beowulf are both examples of extreme human goodness. Compare and contrast them in depth.
- 4. Discuss Satan and the fallen angels in Paradise Lost as examples of human evil.
- 5. Choose a few of Shakespeare's sonnets that we read in class and discuss his use of imagery.
- 6. Explore the theme of overreaching in Marlowe's <u>Doctor Faustus</u>.
