## **PART ONE - DEVELOPMENT**

1) How did Shakespeare's interests and emphases change during his playwriting career as he moved 1) from the early plays to the plays of his middle period, and 2) from these middle plays to the late works. Choose ONE play from EACH of the three periods, and write and essay discussing what you consider the most significant changes, in themes and techniques, that distinguish the middle plays from the early ones and the late plays from the middle ones. Noticing, for instance, that the middle period seems to contain a preponderance of English history plays is not a suitable focal point for comparison since we didn't look at ALL the plays in any particular grouping. Choose plays that you will enjoy writing about, but be specific and analytical in your focus.

#### PART 2 - COMEDY

- 1) Northrop Frye's "Greenworld" has been a dominant and extremely useful paradigm in classifying and explaining Shakespeare's comedies. Explain the basic tenets of the theory and apply it to two comedies that we've looked at in this class. NOTE: If you choose this question DO NOT devote significant discussion to Midsummer Night's Dream.
- 2) Shakespeare's comedies (and indeed the histories and the tragedies) have been fruitfully analyzed in terms of their embodiment of and relationship two more primitive notions of communal accord, festivity, and the carnivalesque. Compare the carnivalesque in at least two plays that we have studied. Don't forget to address the political dimensions of this concept and its potential utility in the plays

# PART 3 - Hamlet

- 1) Discuss the nature of the ghost. Asses the various theories put forward concerning the ghost, where he comes from, and what he signifies to Hamlet and the other characters in the play. Which theory (if any) do you find most compelling and why?
- 2) What's Hamlet's problem? Discuss and asses the various possibilities put forward by various commentators on the nature of Hamlet's character. Which theory (if any) do you find most compelling and why?
