- 3. Discuss the theme of human and /or divine justice in four of the following plays: Hamlet, King Lear, Macbeth, Julius Ceasar, The Tempest.

PART TWO (30 %): Choose TWO of the following quotations. In each case: (1) Identify the quotation. (2) Analyze it. (3) Link one of its ideas or stylistic devices.

1. TITINIUS.

2. ANTHONY. He was my friend, faithful and just to me;
But Brutus says he was ambitious,
And Brutus is an honourable man.

Did this in Ceasar seem ambitious?
