5. How, according to Davidson, can a Tarski-style theory of truth explain the fact that each speaker of a natural language has a potential understanding of an infinite number of sentences?

- 1. a. How does Frege react to the label theory concerning the meaning of ordinary proper names? (15%). b. How does Russell react to the same theory? How does Kripke? (15%). c. What do you think is the best account of the meaning of proper names? Why? Discuss. (40%).
- a. What is the distinction between natural and non-natural meaning according to Grice? (15%). b. How does Grice explain the notion of meaning in his article "Meaning"? (15%). c. Sketch one possible objection to the claim that the notion of conventional linguistic meaning can be explained by appealing to speakers' intentions, and try to respond to it. (40%).
- 3. a. What does the Private Language Argument aim to show about solipsism, and how does it hope to show this? (15%). b. What is the relation between rule-following and speaking a language, and why is rule-following claimed to be an essentially public affair? (15%). c. Do you find the Private Language Argument convincing? Discuss. (40%).
