- 1. Compare and contrast the **pessimistic mood** prevailing in Wordsworth's "The World is Too Much with Us" and Byron's "They Say that Hope is Happiness."
- 2. What do Shelley's west wind and Blake's tiger have in common? Discuss their symbolic qualities.
- 3. Blake and Wordsworth agree that human reason and traditional education are not sufficient for being a full human being. This seems evident in "There is No Natural Religion" and "The Tables Turned", respectively. Wherein, more precisely, lie their similarities but also their differences?
- 4. Discuss 'vanity' in its different guises in "Ozymandias" and "Ode to the West Wind".
- 5. Discuss the vulnerability and limitations of beauty in one of the following pairs:
 - A. Natural (organic/dynamic) Beauty in "She Walks in Beauty" and "Rime of the Ancient Mariner"

OR

B. Artistic (inorganic/static) Beauty in "On a Grecian Urn" and "Ozymandias"
